In so doing those appointed as officers and committee members accept that they are jointly and severally responsible for the organisation of the show and that this is a binding undertaking (vide Kennel Club General Show Regulations F4 and F5).

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 08.30 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time, but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 9.30 am.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the show is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. **Entry fees - KC Competition Classes**
 - Non-Members £15.00 per dog first entry, £3.00 per dog each subsequent entry
 - Members £13.00 per dog first entry, £2.00 per dog each subsequent entry.
 - PUPPY PARADE £5.00 per entry. **(Please provide details on entry form as NFC).**
 - Internet entries accepted payment direct into our Bank Account Name: Southern Alsatian Training Society. Sort Code 52-41-00 Account Number 76610071. Please put the **Surname of the Owner as Reference** on the Payment and send signed entry form to Show Manager Frances Webb.
 - Cheques payable to S.A.T.S. with a signed entry form to Show Manager Mrs Frances Webb.
 - **Catalogues £4.00 paid with entry or £5.00 at show all catalogues not collected will be posted on.**
All dogs entered NFC **MUST be entered and details included on the entry form**
7. There is no prize money on offer at this show.
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition, BUT puppies of 4 calendar months of age are allowed if entered into the Special Puppy Parade which is not to be judged as a competition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
11. **Best Puppy in Show**

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A Puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
12. **Best in Show:**

Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
14. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
15. **All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (annex B) – Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition**

ATTRACTION FROM OUTSIDE THE RING IS PROHIBITED;
KENNEL CLUB RULE F (1)17 h WILL BE ENFORCED

16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS –

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by The Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- * **When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.**
- * **If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.**
- * **The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.**
- * **Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.**
- * **When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.**
- * **Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.**
- * **Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.**

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

18. **Not for Competition** - Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered.
19. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and lead when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11

Right to refuse entries: Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that the show societies have the right Under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

No place for outside attraction

Reminder to all Exhibitors, Judges and Show Organisers

The attraction of exhibits from outside the ring, also known as double handling, is prohibited under Kennel Club Regulations. Despite frequent reminders that this practice is unacceptable, it nonetheless continues in some breeds and in certain cases can even be said to have increased in recent times.

Serious safety issues arise from the sometimes frantic activity seen around some rings. This is a habit of which those members of the public visiting dog shows strongly disapprove and it can provide an extremely hostile environment for visitors to the show and for those competitors who do not indulge in the practice. In addition, the Kennel Club wishes to ensure that all canine competition is fair and that all exhibitors enjoy the highest possible standards in their hobby. Double handling does not allow all exhibitors an equal and fair chance of winning.

The Kennel Club is therefore adopting a strict approach to this activity and all exhibitors, judges and show organisers are reminded of the provisions of the Regulations in respect of double handling:

Regulation F 5: In the event of any major contravention of Kennel Club Rules and Regulations, in particular attraction from outside the ring, the Guarantors and/or such members of the show management to whom the Guarantors have delegated such powers

may order that judging in specific classes, breeds, rings or the show be abandoned.

Regulation F (1) 17 h: The attracting of the attention of exhibits by any method from outside the ring is prohibited. It is the duty of the judge, steward or show management noticing such attraction to ask that it cease.

Regulation F (1) 30 (13): A dog may be disqualified from any award whether an objection has been lodged or not if proved to have been attracted from outside the ring whilst being judged.

To help societies police these Regulations, exhibitors, judges and show organisers should also be aware that the Kennel Club has agreed a form of escalation procedure to allow for enforcement of these provisions. The procedure is in three stages:

1. Request: If attraction is observed, firstly the judge and/or then a senior officer of the society will make a polite request for the activity to desist.

2. Warn: If the conduct is extreme, or continuing, and/or is causing disruption, then a senior officer of the society may enter the ring and suspend the class until it stops.

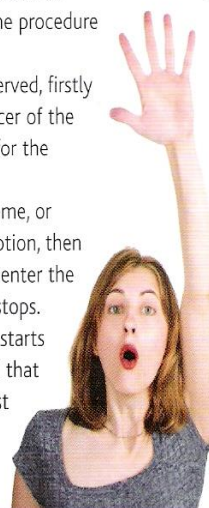
3. Suspend: If the attraction restarts then the exhibitors may be warned that if it continues, and a further request has to be made, then the class will be abandoned.

Where a person attracting the attention of dogs from outside the ring is an exhibitor/competitor or joint owner and is readily identified, he/she should be reported to the Kennel Club for a breach of Regulation F(1) 17h.

The abandonment of a class is clearly an outcome that benefits no-one, but it is nonetheless a necessary final step to ensure that the practice of double handling is prevented and to allow all exhibitors to compete in a fair environment. Exhibitors who see double handling taking place should report their concerns to the management of the show immediately.

Failure to prevent outside attraction using this procedure could place future show licences in jeopardy.

In addition to the responsibility of show officials to deal with this issue, judges too should recall that they are approved by the Kennel Club on the basis that they will uphold Kennel Club Regulations and observe its various codes of practice for judges. It is their responsibility to play a full part in preventing double handling when they are judging. They are reminded that failure to do so may result in the Kennel Club reviewing their future status as a judge.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class
i.e. Friday 9th July 2021

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

1. Withdrawal

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.

2. Transfer

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open for the correct colour, sex weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

- Minor Puppy** For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 9 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
- Puppy** For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 12 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
- Junior** For dogs of 6 and not exceeding 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
- Yearling** For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
- Novice** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate CACIB/CAC/Green Star or 3 or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy excepted, whether restricted or not).

Post Graduate

For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/ CACIB/CAC/Green Star or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

- Limit** For dogs which have not become Show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes confined to breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

- Open** For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

- Veteran** For dogs of not less than 7 years of age on the first day of the Show.

- Champion** For dogs which have been confirmed a Champion, Show Champion under Kennel Club regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club

Not for Competition

Not for Competition Entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered

Special Puppy Parade

For puppies aged between 4 months and 6 months on the day of the show.
Puppies must be entered on an Entry Form with the correct entry fee of £5-00 per puppy.
This is a Not for Competition Class and is a "Parade" only for fun and socialisation purposes.
The Judge will watch the puppies being walked around the ring.
Any puppies who are 6 months of age on the day of the show can only be entered into EITHER the Special Puppy Parade OR a Minor Puppy Class or subsequent competition class but they CANNOT be entered into both. (Can be Standard Coat or Long Coat)
